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CHIEF MINISTER INAUGURATES 233rd INDIAN ROAD CONGRESS MID TERM COUNCIL MEETING

Aizawl, 20th June 2025: The 233rd Mid Term Council Meeting of the Indian Road Congress (IRC) was held today at the Mizoram University (MZU) Auditorium, Aizawl. The event was formally inaugurated by Chief Minister Pu Lalduhoma, who graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. The meeting was also attended by Pu Harsh Malhotra, Union Minister of State for Road Transport & Highways and Corporate Affairs.

In his inaugural address, the Chief Minister emphasized the crucial role of road infrastructure in Mizoram, which currently has only one airport and a single railway line. He pointed out that the state's road density stands at just 46.37 km per 100 sq. km—significantly below the national average of 116 km per 100 sq. km—highlighting a serious infrastructure gap.

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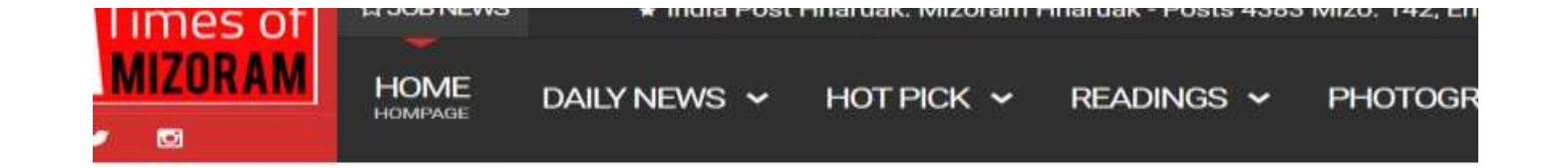
